#### Background

The Graduate School at MSU sets strict requirements for Responsible and Ethical Conduct of Research (RECR) Training (<a href="https://grad.msu.edu/researchintegrity">https://grad.msu.edu/researchintegrity</a>), in part guided by regulatory requirements set by funding agencies. To facilitate keeping track of trainings and compliance with the requirements, RECR training records are documented in the Student Information System (SIS). In this document, the implementation of required RECR trainings in the Department of Physics and Astronomy are described. In addition, instructions for signing up to RECR trainings and making sure they are recorded in SIS are provided.

#### Training requirements

The following three tables provide the training requirements for students who started at different times in the Department's graduate program. Students are held to the training requirements in place when they entered the program. Some training opportunities previously offered are no longer available (or will soon be). Alternatives are identified in the tables.

You can make up for missed trainings by completing them at a later time, but **note that the Graduate** School will start to enforce compliance with RECR training requirements by the end of the 2024 Spring Semester, likely by placing holds on student accounts in case of non-compliance.

Also, please note that you cannot take RECR training to complete future RECR requirements. E.g., if you take more than 3 hours of RECR training in year 3, it cannot be counted towards RECR training for year 4.

Finally, different training requirements apply for students who are in the Ph.D. program, or in the MS program (plan A and Plan B). Note that students who wish to pick up their MS degree along the way to a Ph.D. must meet the MS RECR requirements prior to being able to obtain their degree.

#### Training records in SIS: how-to

The way that training records are entered in SIS depends on the type of training.

- CITI modules: Follow instructions at: https://michiganstate.sharepoint.com/sites/AbilityTrainingSystemHelpFAQ/SitePages/CITIprograms.

  - CITI Modules are also automatically recorded in Ability and transferred to SIS (with a little delay); for the year 2 courses, and other courses you can take, please see the instructions for how to get to them at te end of this documents.
- Graduate school workshops: you can sign up for graduate school workshops at: <a href="https://grad.msu.edu/recr">https://grad.msu.edu/recr</a> Once you register and participate, trainings will be recorded in the Ability system and automatically be transferred to SIS (it takes a week or two before trainings show up in SIS)
- RECR training provided during Departmental Orientation: These will be recorded by the Department
  in Ability during the Fall semester following orientation and transferred automatically to SIS. The code
  is RCR-4867-ILT.
- VERITIES Training (Departmental): These are announced by the Department and recorded by Department in Ability and transferred to SIS. It is important that you register for these trainings and participate in order for your training records to appear. These will also show up with the code RCR-4867-ILT.
- Group-based discussions led by your advisor or instructor (available starting Spring 2022) or Graduate Level Courses that provide live instruction on RECR concepts
  - These must be approved by the Graduate Program Director
  - Records must be submitted by the Graduate Program Director or Coordinator through the Ability system and are subsequently updated in SIS
  - The advisor or departmental instructor must prepare the necessary spreadsheet for uploading into Ability: instructions at:

- One-on-one mentoring by the advisor to the student. A topic of discussion must be selected in addition to a duration (15 minute increments). To record these sessions, follow the instructions at: <a href="https://michiganstate.sharepoint.com/sites/AbilityTrainingSystemHelpFAQ/SitePages/GradPlan%20-%20View,%20enter%201%20on%201.aspx">https://michiganstate.sharepoint.com/sites/AbilityTrainingSystemHelpFAQ/SitePages/GradPlan%20-%20View,%20enter%201%20on%201.aspx</a> Note that these do not count towards group discussion-based training. Students must notify their advisors that they have entered the training in SIS and that they need to approve, as there is no automatic notification.
- (Historical) Discussion based training as part of your annual guidance committee meetings: this option is no longer available, and hasn't been since the end of Fall 2022. You can still record such trainings taken prior to spring 2022 by following these instructions:


